traditional soul and a contemporary style. The title "Blues Summit" is exactly that: a pinnacle of legendary blues players, where, on about half of the 10 tracks, Devon Allman lets others take center stage, making it his most bluesy album to date.

"I always like collaborating with friends and other musicians that serve the song and push for greatness," he said, adding that other musical influences included the late B.B. King, Eric Clapton and The Rolling Stones.

Like any great musician — even those with famous musical parents — Devon Allman committed to his craft to get where

"I worked hard to build relationships, learn from heroes, ask questions and try to improve yearly," he said.

With a diverse catalogue from albums released over the last dozen or so years,

he has plenty of tunes to choose from, so tonight's show will include some from "Blues Summit" — and he's known to play his interpretation of some tunes from The Allman Brothers.

"It's a very diverse, high-energy show," he
