Three local Edwards establishments are joining forces for a night of wine, music and food to support The Museum at Dinosaur Junction in Edwards this Wednesday from 6-8 p.m. Sponsored by Riverwalk Wine & Spirits, Terra Madre Wine Imports and Mountain Fish House, the Winos & Dinos fundraiser invites Eagle County locals and visitors to enjoy 17 different Italian wines, a variety of appetizers, live music by Bill Anderson and the Moonridge Ramblers Band and complimentary caricatures courtesy of artist Ken Carpenter.

"It's also important for people to know the history of what was in their backyards millions of years ago and what to look for now when they are hiking and walking around. Patrons can look forward to tasting wines like Curto Barolo "La Foia" and La Fiorita Brunello di Montalcino, among others, which were handpicked by both Osborne and Terra Madre owners Giuseppe and Alisha Bosco. 

proceeds from ticket sales and auction items go directly to the museum.
